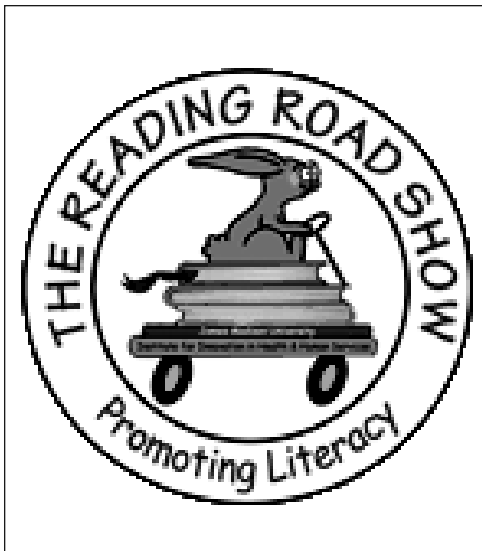

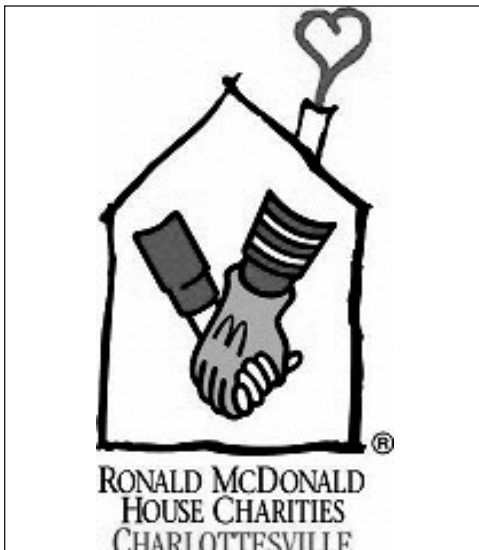

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**Area & Services:** SAAA serves the Northern Shenandoah Valley: Winchester, Frederick, Clarke, Shenandoah, Page and Warren. Annually, SAAA prepares over 81,000 meals with over 70% delivered to homebound individuals and the remainder served at 7 different Active Living Centers. SAAA provides a wide range of services including in-home assessments, information and referrals through experienced Care managers who help develop individualized plans of care utilizing community and agency services for homebound seniors, WellTran (door-to-door accessible transportation for qualified older adults and adults with disabilities), an Ombudsman who helps families resolve issues with long term care, a group respite program for persons with early to mid-stage Alzheimer's disease (Clarke & Shenandoah Counties), assistance with personal care and housekeeping for qualified homebound seniors, Medicare Insurance Counseling through the Virginia insurance Counseling & Assistance Program (VICAP), and Stanford University Evidence Based Chronic Disease Self-Management Workshops.

**Eligibility:** Varies based on program, but the majority are targeted to those age 60+ and their caregivers. Well-Tran provides rides for persons aged 18 and older with disabilities, but does NOT service persons who receive Medicaid. Persons receiving Medicaid are eligible for LogistiCare.
