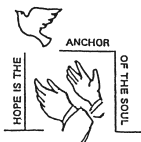

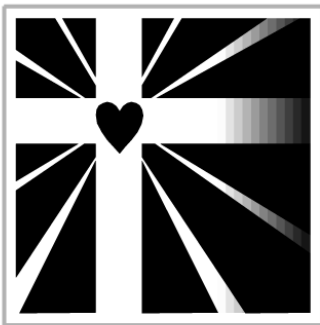

Centralized Housing Intake serves as the coordinated assessment, intake, and referral source for homelessness services agencies within the service area of the Western Virginia Continuum of Care.

Area & Services: Centralized Intake is housed in Mercy House in Harrisonburg and is a part of the Western Virginia Continuum of Care (CoC). The CoC serves Frederick, Warren, Shenandoah, Clarke, Page, and Rockingham County, and cities of Winchester and Harrisonburg.

Eligibility: Centralized Intake specifically focuses on providing housing assistance to those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. There is not eligibility criteria to call into Centralized Intake. However, the agencies in which Centralized Intake makes referrals to each have their own sets of eligibility criteria. When someone calls or visits Intake, they will be asked various questions to determine which agency would be the best fit for that client.

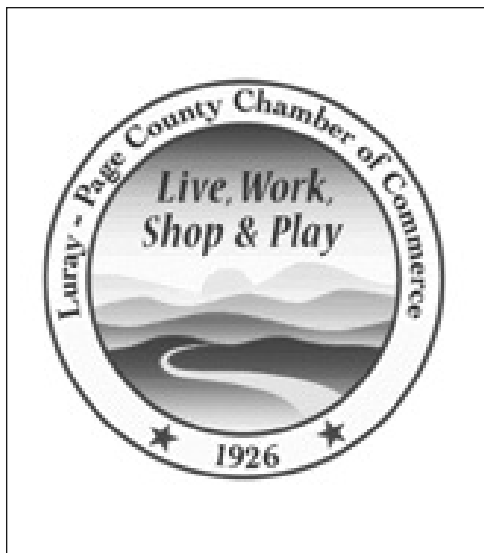

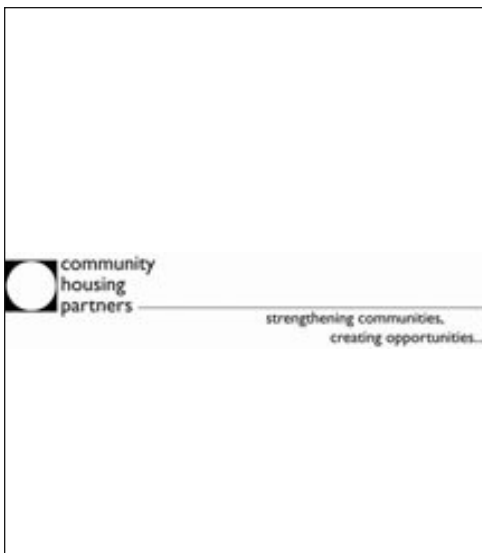

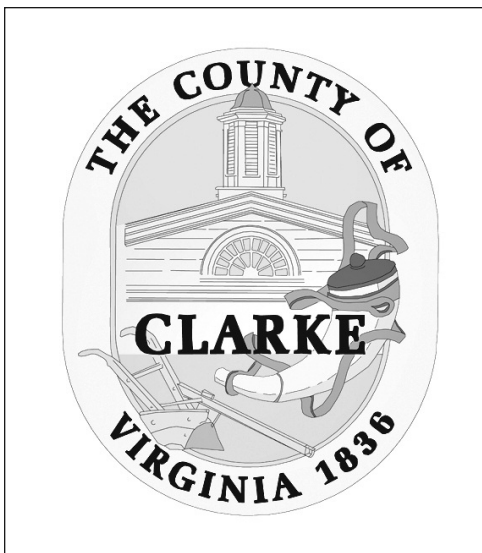
