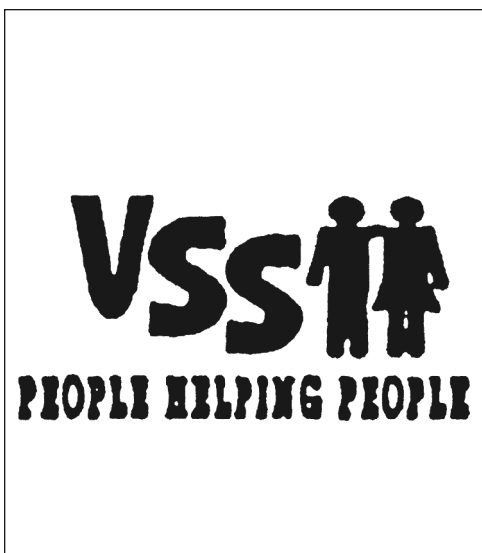

Family Promise of Shenandoah County enables our community to work together to address the needs of homeless children & their families. Providing hospitality (shelter), meals, and comprehensive services, Family Promise helps families achieve lasting self-sufficiency.

The Family Promise Network Program will provide safe, overnight hospitality, meals and support services to families without homes through a network of 13 local congregations and the Family Center in Woodstock. The Family Center will provide a space for participants in the program to seek employment, develop skills, and network with community agencies. It will also provide office space for the Executive Director (the only paid, full time employee) who will work with families to implement plans that they will work toward as they strive to become self-sufficient, successful members of our community. Services available to families include counseling for employment success, parenting and life skills classes, budgeting courses, referrals to social services and housing agencies, and assistance with transportation. There will also be shower and laundry facilities at the Family Center and limited storage for personal belongings of guests.

Eligibility:

Homeless families with at least one child under the age of 18. Family must agree to follow established Policies. Must be: Free from alcohol & illegal drugs, Free from mental health crisis, No threat to other guests or volunteers (must agree to background checks), not chronically homeless.

Volunteer Needs:

Since this is primarily an **all-volunteer** program there are many volunteer opportunities. Volunteers are needed to provide meals, socialize with families, assist children with homework, play games, etc. Volunteers with special skills may teach classes to families &/or children. Volunteers may help with moving supplies or perform Family Center office work. They may assist with or lead special projects.
