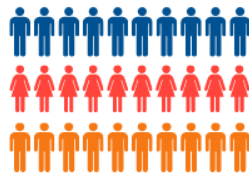


UNITED WAY'S VALLEY ASSISTANCE NETWORK @ WORK IN THE COMMUNITY

REAL CHALLENGES

Since the COVID-19 outbreak began, VAN has seen a 72% increase in requests for help, with an average of 130 new families each month. Thousands of our neighbors – who have never needed help before – are struggling with housing, food and utilities.
