

EDUCATION KEY FINDINGS

All jurisdictions saw an increase in on-time graduation rates

> :2:7 For every local occupation that requires a master's degree or more, two professional jobs require a university degree and there are 7 jobs that require a 1 year certificate or 2-year degree.

For a minimum wage family, childcare costs could be upwards of 69.4% of their income.

10% of adult welfare recipients have low literacy levels. There is a clear correlation between more education and higher earnings, and between higher educational scores and higher earnings.
